

Croatian Camp 2012 - Culture & Adventure.

Dear participants

We would like to announce that Croatian Rotary Clubs - District 1913 is organizing Summer camp in Summer of 2012.

The Camp starts in Dubrovnik on Saturday, July 21st and will last until Saturday August 4th 2012.

Participants are supposed to leave Zagreb on the 4th August 2012.

The Programme of the camp

Dubrovnik and surroundings:	July 21 st – July 24 th
Travel to Split, Split & surroundings:	July 24 th – July 27 th
Travel to Šibenik, Šibenik & surroundings:	July 27 th – July 29 th
Travel to Rijeka, Rijeka:	July 29 th – July 30 th
Krasno and mountain Velebit:	July 30 th – August 1 st
National Park Plitivička Jezera, Zagreb:	August 1 st
Zagreb:	August 1 st – 4 th
Departure from Zagreb:	August 4 th

When does the Summer camp starts and finish?

All participants should arrive in Dubrovnik on the 21st of July. The plane ticket should have Dubrovnik as the final destination (preferentially through Zagreb because of the fair price and because participants fly home from **Zagreb** on the 4th of August.

The organizer does not cover the price of both arrival and departure flights for the participants. The last day of our camp is Saturday, August 4th 2012. The return flight is proposed for August 4th from Zagreb.

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About the Programme (see: www.rotary.hr/exchange/ Croatian camp)

Dubrovnik is one of the most beautiful cities on the Mediterranean Sea. During their stay in Dubrovnik participants will have the opportunity for sightseeing in this old city and getting information about its glory throughout history. Excursions to the neighboring city of Cavtat, swimming and other activities will be organized.



After 3 days in Dubrovnik participants will travel to Split by bus. Split is central city in southern Croatia, an incredible combination of history, Mediterranean and modern way of life, with lots of interesting things to see within it and in its surroundings.

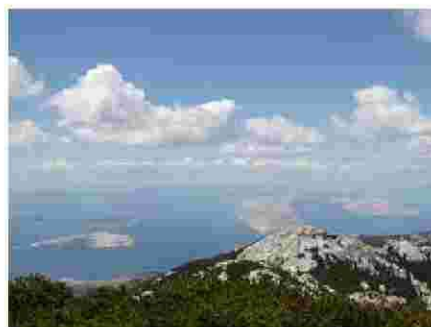


From Split participants will travel to Šibenik, historic city literally surrounded by national parks, visit to National Park "Waterfalls of Krka" is planned.



From Šibenik participants will travel to Rijeka, for a short visit of both Rijeka and Opatija, and from where they will travel to the small village of Krasno in the region of the National Park Velebit.

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Next day, 5 – 6 hours walking tour through the Velebit mountain with a wonderful view on Croatian islands in the North Adriatic will take place. After two nights in the Velebit region the trip continues to one of the most beautiful National Parks of Croatia “Plitvice lakes”, from which, after sightseeing participants will travel to Zagreb, capital of Croatia. During their stay in Zagreb the city-sightseeing will be organized, as well as visit to the castles in the surroundings of Zagreb and to the Museum of Neanderthals is organized. The return home is planned for August 4th.



Meetings with the members of local Rotary clubs will be organized in every major city, in the cities along the coast, swimming and visits to the beaches will be organized when and wherever possible. For the visits to the national parks participants should bring and wear comfortable shoes and clothes.

During their stay in Croatia participants will be accompanied by a member from one of the Croatian Rotaract Clubs and a professional mountain guide. In Dubrovnik, Split, Šibenik, Rijeka, Opatija and Zagreb they will meet members of the local Rotary clubs.

All the meals and lodging, entrance tickets and bus travel costs are provided by the Croatian Youth Exchange Program.

Important notices :

Completed Application Form must be sent until 20th of May 2012.

Every participant must be insured – the information about the insurance is available below.

If the participant has some other insurance which covers everything as in UNIQA insurance below (important: helicopter transport must be included), they have to take the papers of their insurance with them. They will have to show those papers to the Rotarians on their arrival.

Besides the basic already mentioned above the registered participants will get information about accessories they will need for this camp.

Croatian Youth Exchange Team is looking forward to meet the participants and wish them pleasant stay in Croatia.

Summary^{*)}
of the most important Provisions of the General Agreement on
Health Insurance concluded with Rotary International
(revised Jan 2010)

Preliminary statement

By payment of the correct premium (to be calculated on one's own in compliance with instructions) you are insured within the health insurance agreement (in the updated version) concluded on 9 June 1997 between Rotary International, Multidistrict Youth Exchange for the districts 1910, 1911 and 1920, Vienna, Austria, and UNIQA Personenversicherung AG, Vienna, Austria. Payment must be made by the especially preprinted Austrian "Bank-Zahlscheine" or by foreign money transfer to the suspense account facilitated for this purpose by the broker firm Versicherungsbüro Dr. Nemling.

Mentioned below are the most important provisions of this insurance contract.

1. When does the insurance pay ?

Your insurance pays if

- ✓ your premium was paid,
- ✓ you get an acute illness or you have an accident outside of your residence country,
- ✓ this illness or accident happens within the term insured,
- ✓ you have this illness or accident treated, inpatient or outpatient, outside of your residence country and
- ✓ you have incurred expenses.

2. What is covered by the insurance protection ?

- 2.1. Up to an amount of 500.000 €^{**)} for urgent and necessary medical treatment compensation will be given for

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- ✓ full expenses of hospitalization (legal or publicized tariff) in the best available general ward accommodation (or equivalent local term) of a public hospital including cost of necessary transport,
- ✓ full expenses of hospitalization (legal or publicized tariff) in a superior accommodation if
 - existing equivalent home insurance is valid also in the country concerned,
 - the regular ward is occupied,
 - the regular ward is not open to foreigners,
 - the regular ward is medically unqualified.
- ✓ full compensation of
 - outpatient treatment and
 - dental emergency (easing of toothache),in both cases including prescribed medicine. Reimbursement for outpatient treatment and dental pain relief is limited to 2.500 € within the entire sum insured of 500.000 €.

2.2. Dental prosthesis after accidents up to 440 € per prosthesis.

2.3. Full compensation of necessary ambulance transport from abroad to a hospital of the home or residence country as well as the costs of normal repatriation of remains to the residence country. Previous clearance with UNIQA is necessary. If a clearance from UNIQA has not been obtained, reimbursement of necessary expenses is limited to 1.820 €.

2.4. Costs of rescue up to 7.300 €.

2.5. Emergency visitation costs for a closer related person in case of a hospitalization abroad of two weeks or more. Compensation will be granted for adequate transportation (tourist class on planes) but not for the stay.

3. What is excluded ?

In particular in the following cases no compensation can be given for:

- ✓ treatments which began prior to the start of the trip,
- ✓ treatments of chronic illnesses, except when resulting from acute attacks,
- ✓ treatments which are the reason for the trip,
- ✓ treatments in connection with a pregnancy existing prior to the start of the trip, abortions,
- ✓ treatments as a result of drug or medicine abuse,
- ✓ cures and rehabilitation,
- ✓ dental treatments, more than first aid and pain relief, and dental prosthesis except as a consequence of an accident,
- ✓ preventive medicine, check ups, prophylactic vaccinations

4. What is to be done in the case of an insured event ?

4.1. Outpatient treatment : Ask for a bill indicating your name, date of birth, the diagnosis and the treatments carried out, including purchases of medicine. Please pay the bill and have the receipt acknowledged. Send the bill – in German, English or French – to UNIQA Personenversicherung AG, Untere Donaustrasse 21, 1029 Vienna, Austria, care of Mrs. Christa Schmid.

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- 4.2. Inpatient treatment in Austria : Please notify UNIQA and call (01) 211 75, ext. 1196, Mrs. Schmid, fax ext. 79 1196.
- 4.3. Inpatient treatment outside of Austria and ambulance transport back home.

Please do not act without instructions !

Please contact immediately UNIQA's SOS-Service, which is available 24 hours 7 days a week, Mrs. Vesely, phone +43 1 204 99 99, free line within Austria 0800 204 99 99. This procedure makes you feel secure and is necessary for an advance payment and full reimbursement of transport costs. Please see pt. 2.3.

5. What to do in case of an existing compulsory or other private insurance ?

Claims should first be directed to the compulsory (legal) or other private insurance carrier. Before you go on a journey, please ask your compulsory or private insurance carrier about your benefits and ask for proper documentation for the stay abroad, such as policy (photo)copies, service cards and social security certificates.

Important ! In the case of an insured event (see pt. 4), give us the name of your compulsory or private insurance carrier and the policy number.
